Motor Trolley Shuttle & Tour of Historic Easton

Approx. every 40 min, until 5 pm. Stops at Bachmann Publick House, Spring Garden & Sitgreaves strs, Northampton & 4th strs. Library & Central Fire Station, State Theatre, Easton Cemetery, Courthouse parking lots, St. John's Church, Jacob Nicholas House/Fifth & Ferry strs, and Ferry & Sitgreaves strs. Charges apply.

• **Live Revolutionary War era artillery and musket demonstrations** by Proctor's Pennsylvania Artillery Company and Craig's Artillery Company will be held all afternoon in Riverside Park until 5 pm. Meet the soldiers, see their encampment. And hear the cannons roar!

• Members of the 71st Volunteer Infantry Company will present **life during the Civil War**, all afternoon, in Riverside Park, until 5 pm. See soldiers' camp life in the mid-nineteenth century!

• The Bachmann Publick House will be open to the public all afternoon following the reading until 5 pm. See the **Henry Longrifle exhibit in the back tavern room**, presented by Jacobsburg Historical Society.

• **The Lenape Nation will be opening its new Cultural Center** at the Bachmann Publick House, with the ribbon cutting at 10:30 am.

• Easton Lions serving **complimentary pink lemonade** on the porch at the Bachmann Publick House 11 am to 3 pm.

• **The Jacob Nicholas House**, at Fifth and Ferry streets, will be open for **docent-led tours** from 1 to 5 pm.

• **The Sigal Museum building** will hold an open house (first floor only) and membership drive from noon to 4 pm.

• See the house where **George Taylor, signer of the Declaration of Independence, and William Parsons, Surveyor General of Pennsylvania and the architect of Downtown Easton's street plan, lived in the late 18th century.** The Parsons-Taylor house is located at Fourth and Ferry streets and will be open to the public from noon to 4 pm.
